THE FACTS

What: Police Week Michigan is a reflection of National Police Week started by President John F. Kennedy in 1962.

It is a period of days, every May, established to honor Law Enforcement. The most important date during the annual week is always May 15, Peace Keeper Memorial Day, a day to memorialize those who have given their lives in the line of duty. The days surrounding it are to be intentional in thanking the men and women who continue to serve (and their families) to keep us safe and our communities in peace.

Police Week Michigan was launched in 2019; it is a non-partisan, statewide, 501c3.

In light of the increased attacks on our officers, it is the hope to use the organization of *Police Week Michigan* as a central location to garner ideas, share positive stories, post events, and share facts. It is a movement of citizens who desire to stand up, speak up, show up in support of Michigan Law Enforcement, year round.

When: National Police Week in 2023 is May 14 - 20, 2023 *Police Week Michigan* is ongoing.

Where: We encourage people to take a stand, be visual, and be vocal in their local communities for their local Law Enforcement.

How: People can celebrate Police Week in a way that fits their family, neighborhood, and community. Celebrating Law Enforcement should be year- round and does not have to be done during this official national week. We hope individuals will do what is meaningful to their local Law Enforcement.

Why: It is our belief that the majority of Americans support and appreciate Law Enforcement. But what our Officers see and hear on a daily basis is quite the opposite.

We want to be a help in delivering encouragement and appreciation to our Officers. Regardless of the time of year we want them to know that citizens have their back.

HISTORY OF POLICE WEEK

Police Week was launched in 1962 by President John F. Kennedy

In the "87th Congress of the United States of America H.J.Res. 730 October 1, 1962 Public Law 87-726 Joint Resolution 76 Stat. 676. that states:

"To pay tribute to the law enforcement officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our country and to voice our appreciation for all those who currently serve on the front lines of the battle against crime, the Congress, by a joint resolution approved October 1, 1962...has authorized and requested the President to designate May 15 of each year as "Peace Officers Memorial Day," and the week in which it falls as "National Police Week"

CURRENT PROJECTS & BUDGET

Our goal is to raise money for a billboard campaign throughout the state, along the highways supporting Law Enforcement.

Our goal, at minimum, is to have them displayed during Police Week in the month of May and with extra resources, the message will be conducive to longer displays. We have been informed by members of Law Enforcement in Michigan, including by a top Sheriff, that this would be very meaningful to Michigan's Officers.

We would like to raise at least \$25,000.00 for this project, and the more we raise the more awareness we can spread throughout every corner of Michigan.

ADDITIONAL GOALS AND AMBITIONS:

- Email Information: Consistent electronic email communications with good news, information on Officers in Michigan, and ways that citizens can help
- Educational Summits: where we bring together Law Enforcement and citizens to inform them on important matters that is not often understood
- Social Media Growth: With increased financial means we will be able to do advertisement and promotion online to allow for more growth and awareness of this movement
- Legislature Education: We are a non-partisan organization that hopes to use our position to make sure all Legislators are fully informed on Law Enforcement. There are existing organizations already servicing this need but the need is great
- Hands-on Experience for the Media: We hope to host "on site" tours for media so they can have an up front and in person experience with what it is like behind the scenes. (If we want Law Enforcement to be better represented in the media, we need to help the media understand them.)
- Outreach to Sub-Groups: We hope to do mailings to churches, put materials in the hands of Teachers with ideas on how they can foster a love of Law Enforcement in classrooms, and find ways to get Chambers of Commerce (and the like) more involved.
